Instead of visiting many other places, I opened up my house and learned a lot about sharing and communal living that way! There were in total *26* people who stayed in my place during the year! Either alone or with kids; staying shorter or longer time periods; friends, family or total strangers,

recommended by friends. And it's a small apartment in Amsterdam, so often we were crammed... but at other times I was able to be at Arnd's place so there was more flexibility... For the next year, feel free to visit, I got even better at handling guests and co-living:)

- I did many other travels with children: to the cities from A to Z: Alphen a/d Rijn, Barcelona, Belgrade, Kopar, London, Zadar;
- and to nature-admiring places: dunes at Overveen, Adriatic coast in Karin, forests at Hoge Veluwe...
- Most fun, exchange of ideas and new friendships happened at conferences:
 MoneyLab in Amsterdam, Radical Openness in Linz, Interference in
 Amsterdam, BalCCon in Novi Sad, GreenPeace hackathon in Amsterdam
